## FAQs

### What happens in the Independent Study Room ?

- The student will be provided with appropriate work whilst in the ISR and parents / carers will be informed

### What happens if a student is absent on the day they are scheduled to be in the Independent Study Room ?

- Students will complete their sanction after their absence. This includes absence due to illness and Fixed Term Exclusions

### How does Learning Ready affect students with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities?

- All students at Bristol Metropolitan Academy are expected to follow the Academy Learning Ready rules so all students can be successful and happy.
- The Special Needs Coordinator and the Senior Leadership Team will take into account a student's identified special needs or disability when deciding how and when students are sent to the ISR.
- Other provision may also be made to help identified students be successful at Bristol Metropolitan Academy



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## Our Promise at Bristol Met

**We believe that all of our students have a right to learn without disruption. From the beginning of term six there will be a change to Bristol Metropolitan Academy. We are extending our Learning Ready approach of the classroom to become a whole Academy learning and behaviour policy. In short, a new focus on ensuring EVERY student has the right to learn without disruption.**

In order to protect valuable learning time and ensure students stay focussed in the classroom, we will have a simplified approach to our behaviour system.

### Our Learning Ready behaviour policy

- Eliminates disruptive behaviour
- Ensures that students understand what behaviour is acceptable
- Encourages students to take responsibility for their actions
- Enables staff to deliver engaging, creative and enjoyable lessons
- Enables EVERY student to maximise their learning potential

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## Key rules to Learning Ready

1. Attend school in correct uniform; arrive on time and be "Learning Ready"
2. Listen to and follow instructions promptly
3. Work to the best of one's ability
4. Complete and present work to a high standard
5. Be polite and respect everyone's right to learn in a safe environment

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**What happens if a student chooses not to follow one of the Learning Ready rules?**

- A warning will be given by the classroom teacher
- If a disruptive behaviour continues, the student will be removed from their classroom and spend a full school day in the Independent Study Room (ISR). This means that a child sent to the ISR at 11am will remain there for the rest of that day and until 11am the following day.
- The ISR will run for half an hour after the end of the school day. Break times will also be altered for those students.

**What happens if a student refuses to go to the ISR or continues to misbehave?**

- Students who refuse to go to the ISR could receive a one day Fixed Term Exclusion.
- The student together with parents / carers will then need to attend a reintegration meeting before starting back at school.
