Dear Parents/Carers,

What glorious weather we have been having for the last few weeks. I sincerely hope that we haven't see our "summer" yet just as our young people and families are gearing up for some quality time together.

Another year passes. Another cohort of Year 11 have left us, successfully prepared for the next stage of their journey. I wanted to publicly thank them for their efforts this year and wish them every success on 22nd August when they open their long awaited results envelopes. They really deserve great outcomes as they have all worked diligently and tirelessly this year. As we say goodbye to Year 11 we are preparing to welcome our next group of Year 7, all 225 of them. This signifies the largest cohort of students ever to enter Bristol Met, a real show of community belief in the Academy and thank you to every family that has helped continue to strengthen our reputation as educator of choice in the local area.

I know the Summer break is also a time when many of us have to kit out our young people in new uniform. Before you do buy new items please take a moment to check carefully the guidance in our recently published Parent/Carer Handbook which was sent out in the post and is also available online. Please do not rely on shops calling their range "Back 2 School". 'Initially Yours' (in Soundwell) is our approved supplier so you can be assured that anything bought from them is acceptable. You are welcome to buy from other outlets but please take time to check properly that it will be acceptable. We don't want to start the new Academic year in conflict with our young people about uniform but we do believe in high standards.

We have also just had our latest Student Leader Elections and it is with real pride that I can announce that our Senior Student Leaders for the year ahead are Justina T and Jamie H. Our Deptuy Senior Student Leaders are, Patrycja S and Tomek S. Our Chairperson is Shezadi A. These students were nominated (either by themselves, peers or staff) then were interviewed by senior leaders and finally made a manifesto video which was then viewed and voted on by every student in the Academy. It takes a lot of courage to put yourself in this position in the first place so not only a massive well done to these students but also to every student who put themselves forward and/or have become part of the wider student council.

A plea from me for September for those who come by bike. We secure the bike sheds from between 9am and 3pm. We have to have the sheds unlocked as students arrive and then to allow them to leave. Given the size of the academy it can take a staggered time period for students to exit site so sometimes bikes are in an unlocked bike shed for upwards of an hour. Unfortunately we get the odd stolen bike which is always disappointing for us and upsetting for students and families. Please can I urge that good quality bike locks (D-Lock is recommended) are purchased as they are almost impossible to break. Unfortunately lower end bike locks are very easy to force open in seconds which results in upset.

As well as the above there have been lots of other things happening in the Academy over the last term. You can read about many of these in the newsletter that follows.

I wanted to wish all of our community a great and safe 6 weeks. Please do take the time to talk to your young people about keeping themselves safe over the Summer. In particular about safety in and around the roads, railways (particularly as local rail lines are now electrified) and any bodies of

water, particularly in the hot weather where there is added attraction. It is also a good time to remind young people about 'stranger danger' especially when out on their own.

We will see our new Year 7 and new Year 11 (current Year 10) on Tuesday 3rd September at **8:35am.** All other year groups start back on Wednesday 4th September at 8:35am.

Year 11 Prom


Prom was a great success as we said a final goodbye to our Year 11's whom were a credit to the school. And Excellent night was had by all who attended.

We had two very good runs with Level 1 gaining 95.42% and Level two achieving 91.69%. Both categories where VERY competitive, level 1 competed against 8 other schools and level 2 competed against 6 other schools.

We are bringing home two new shiny trophies, with both teams placing 3rd in the country. Both teams narrowly (0.35% and 0.57%) missing out on second.
